

Adventure Racers Head to Southern California for Four Winds' Fall Mountain Rage Series Race Sept. 15-16

Sedona, Ariz. — Fronted by ocean and backed by the Sierra Nevada's southernmost peaks, Ventura County will be the host site of Four Winds' first Mountain Rage Series race in Southern California Sept. 15-16.

In this third installment of the Four Winds 2000 racing series, Mountain Rage/Ventura will find coed and open teams of four and two challenging themselves and competing against each other across a 100-plus mile secret course that will entail flat water paddling, mountain biking, hiking, climbing, rappelling and orienteering—in less than 36 hours.

Boasting a population larger than Montana, Ventura County neighbors Los Angeles County, yet enjoys abundant wilderness and beauty often undiscovered by those living in the nearby major metropolitan area.

The Mountain Rage series kicked off earlier this year with Mountain Rage/Lake Roosevelt, won by Santa Cruz, California-based S.C.A.R./press.htm/Hi-Tec. In May, Canadian team Subaru took home first place honors at Mountain Rage/Clear Lake, in Northern California. These and other teams have been accumulating points throughout the 2000 season toward the series title that will be determined at the year's last race—Mountain Rage/Lake Mead, Nov. 4-5.
